Erich Zimmerman - Mr. Zimmerman has served as the conductor for TVW in preparation for this evening's concert. He is currently in his 20th year as a music educator in Middle TN. He began his teaching career in Sumner County, then transferred to Davidson Co. for 10 years, before moving to Rutherford County where he is currently the Co-Director of bands at Rock Springs Middle and Christiana Middle Schools.



In addition to teaching, he remains active in performance, being a founding member of the Capitol Brass Quintet. Prior to teaching, Mr. Zimmerman was a trumpet instrumentalist with the United States Navy Band, Washington D.C. His tour of duty included a 1988 national tour and weekly concerts. He was also a free lance musician in the Washington D.C. area.

Mr. Zimmerman's education includes a Bachelor of Science Degree in Music Education from TN Tech Univ., a Master of Music Degree in Trumpet Performance from the Univ. of Texas, and a Master's + 30 certificate from MTSU in Administration and Supervision. He is a member of the Music Educator's National Conference, the TN Music Education Assoc. where he served on the Board of Directors, and a member of Mid-TN Band Orchestra Assoc. where he served as President. He is also a member of Phi Mu Alpha, a professional music fraternity, and Phi Beta Mu, an honorary band director's fraternity.

Brant Karrick - Brant Karrick joined the faculty of Northern KY University in the fall of 2003 as Director of Bands. His prior teaching experience includes nine years at the Univ. of Toledo and seven years of public school teaching in KY.

At NKU, he administrates the entire band program including Symphonic Winds, the Concert Band and Basketball Pep Band. He teaches classes in conducting, music education, marching band techniques, and assists with student teacher supervision. In addition to his responsibilities at NKU, Dr. Karrick is an active guest conductor, adjudicator, clinician, composer, and music arranger. His band compositions have been performed around the country, in Europe, and in Australia.



Mr. Karrick began his service as a public school teacher in 1984 at Beechwood School in Fort Mitchell, KY. In 1996 he returned to his Alma Mater, Bowling Green (KY) HS as Director of Instrumental Music. His concert bands received superior ratings at regional and state festivals each year and in 1988 his marching band was named Class AA State Champions.

In 1994, Karrick completed his Ph. D program in Music Education at Louisiana State Univ. His prior education includes a Bachelor of Music Education from the Univ. of Louisville in 1982, and a Master of Arts in Education from Western KY Univ. in 1984. He studeied trumpet with Leon Rapier and conducting with Frank Wickes. His composition teachers included David Livingston, Steve Beck, and Cecil Karrick.

Mr. Karrick is a member of the Music Educators National Conference, the KY Music Educators Assoc., Phi Beta Mu, ASCAP, the National Band Assoc., and the College Band Directors National Assoc.

The Tennessee Valley Winds is a non-profit, all volunteer, self-supporting community band that has been providing quality musical performances since 1984. The community band experience is unlike school or professional groups. Rarely do amateurs and professionals, young and old, get to work together. It offers a unique opportunity to learn and grow. The director is more of a guide than an authority figure, and does not assign parts or solos. It is expected that all will help each other by offering suggestions and sharing. Friendships are born of shared work and musical enjoyment.

The TVW has been able to offer opportunities for musicians to perform with other ensembles. They have shared concerts with the MTSU Faculty and Student Ensembles, the Nashville Symphony Orchestra, the Columbia Community Band, Motlow College Jazz Ensemble, and several Middle Tennessee school bands and choirs. They have performed at the Schermerhorn Symphony Hall on two occasions.

The founder and director from 1984-2000 was Joseph T. Smith. He is retired as MTSU Band Director and was inducted as TVW's first Conductor Emeritus for his many years of service and dedication. Under his direction, the band performed at several TMEA conventions, the Mid-West Clinic International Conference, and even performed in London, England.

From 2000-2010, the TVW was directed by Terry Jolley, currently a Band Director in the Rutherford County Schools. Mr. Jolley led the band to new heights and was inducted as the TVW's second Conductor Emeritus in 2010.
