Dr. Stephen Rhodes Dr. Stephen L. Rhodes, professor of music at Lipscomb University, directs the University Wind Ensemble, Jazz Band, and Chamber Orchestra, and teaches courses including conducting, secondary music education, brass methods, orchestration, and History of Jazz.

He received the D.A. degree in instrumental conducting and the M.M. degree in brass performance from the University of Northern Colorado, as well as the B.M.Ed. degree from Abilene Christian University. Prior to coming to Lipscomb Dr. Rhodes taught in the public schools of Texas.

Dr. Rhodes has published articles in BDGuide and The Instrumentalist as well as Performance Study Guides of Essential Works for Band. Dr. Rhodes' book, "A History of the Wind Band," is available online.

He is founder and director of the Nashville Wind Ensemble, a group of select musicians who perform band literature of high quality. He is also conductor of the Nashville Double Reed Ensemble. Dr. Rhodes has served as guest adjudicator/conductor for numerous ensembles from the elementary to the university level, as well as serving as judge and clinician for a variety of music festivals. He is a regular conductor for the Tennessee Governor's School for the Arts.



Erich Zimmerman, Conductor of the Tennessee Valley Winds, is currently in his 22nd year as a music educator in Middle TN. He began his teaching career in Sumner County, then transferred to Davidson Co. for 10 years, before moving to Rutherford County where he is currently the Co-Director of bands at Rock Springs Middle and Christiana Middle Schools.

In addition to teaching, Mr. Zimmerman remains active in performance, being a founding member of the Capitol Brass Quintet. Prior to teaching, he was a trumpet instrumentalist with the United States Navy Band, Washington D.C. His tour of duty included a 1988 national tour and weekly concerts. He was also a freelance musician in the Washington D.C. area.

Mr. Zimmerman's education includes a Bachelor of Science Degree in Music Education from TN Tech Univ., a Master of Music Degree in Trumpet Performance from the Univ. of Texas, and a Master's + 30 certificate from MTSU in Administration and Supervision. He is a member of the Music Educator's National Conference, the TN Music Education Assoc. where he served on the Board of Directors, and a member of Mid-TN Band Orchestra Assoc. where he served as President. He is also a member of Phi Mu Alpha, a professional music fraternity, and Phi Beta Mu, an honorary band director's fraternity.

Greg Lawson, Associate Conductor of the Tennessee Valley Winds. He has been a music educator for the past 28 years. Mr. Lawson holds degrees from Middle Tennessee State University (B.A. in 1981 for Music Education and EDS in 1993 for Administration & Supervision) and Cincinnati Conservatory of Music (M.M. in 1983). After receiving his Master of Music degree, he began his teaching career at Franklin Road Academy in Nashville. In 1988, Mr. Lawson started the band program at LaVergne High School where he remained for 13 years. Over the next five years, he taught at McGavock High School in Nashville and Oakland High School in Murfreesboro, TN. Mr. Lawson is currently a band director in the Murfreesboro City School System.

In addition to his teaching, Mr. Lawson has had the honor of conducting the 2nd Junior High Mid State Band, several Kentucky Honor bands and the All-Metro Honor Band. He is an active clarinetist holding the position of principal clarinet with the Murfreesboro Symphony for the past 27 years. He is also the Bass Clarinetist with the Huntsville Symphony and plays in numerous other community groups and chamber ensembles.

In 2003, Mr. Lawson was selected as the "School Band and Orchestra" Tennessee Honoree as one of "50 Directors Who Make a Difference". He was inducted into the MTSU Band of Blue Hall of Fame in 1996. He holds membership in Music Educators National Conference, Tennessee Band Master Association, Middle Tennessee State Band and Orchestra Association, International Clarinet Society, Local 257 of the Association of Federal Musicians, Phi Mu Alpha, Phi Kappa Delta, twice elected Who's Who of American Teachers, and an elected member of Phi Beta Mu.

The Tennessee Valley Winds is a non-profit, all volunteer, self-supporting community band that has been providing quality musical performances since 1984. The community band experience is unlike school or professional groups. Rarely do amateurs and professionals, young and old, get to work together. It offers a unique opportunity to learn and grow. The director is more of a guide than an authority figure, and does not assign parts or solos. It is expected that all will help each other by offering suggestions and sharing. Friendships are born of shared work and musical enjoyment.

The TVW has been able to offer opportunities for musicians to perform with other ensembles. They have shared concerts with the MTSU Faculty and Student Ensembles, the Nashville Symphony Orchestra, the Columbia Community Band, Motlow College Jazz Ensemble, and several Middle Tennessee school bands and choirs. They have performed at the Schermerhorn Symphony Hall on four occasions.

The founder of TVW and director from 1984-2000 was Joseph T. Smith. He is retired as MTSU Band Director and was inducted as TVW's first Conductor Emeritus for his many years of service and dedication. Under his direction, the band performed at several TMEA conventions, the Mid-West Clinic International Conference, and even performed in London, England.

From 2000-2009, the band was under the direction of Terry Jolley, who presently works for the Murfreesboro City School District. He has served as the band director at MTSU, Warren County HS, Overton HS, and in the Rutherford County School System. Mr. Jolley led the band to new heights and was inducted as the TVW's second Conductor Emeritus in 2010.

After an extended search in 2010, TVW was pleased to welcome Mr. Erich Zimmerman as their new conductor and Mr. Greg Lawson as their new associate conductor in 2011. We look forward to many more great years under their direction and leadership.
