

Joseph T. Smith, Conductor

As professor of music at Middle Tennessee State University, Joseph Smith directs the marching band, concert band, and wind ensemble. In addition to his long tenure at Middle Tennessee State, he directed high school instrumental programs in Tennessee and Georgia prior to his present position.

Mr. Smith is in frequent demand as clinician, having served as conductor, adjudicator, or clinician in twenty-six states, as well as Mexico and Canada. For several years he conducted workshops at the prestigious Vandercook School of Music in Chicago. He is active in promoting and improving bands as is evident in the variety of advisory positions on national boards and his frequent contributions to professional magazines. He is well known as founding director of the Contest of Champions which is viewed nationally via educational television, the All-State Wind Ensemble Conference, the Tennessee Bandmasters State Concert Festival and the Southeastern Instrumental Clinics. He is the recipient of the National Band Association "Citation of Excellence," and the Third Army distinguished service award, is a national patron of Delta Omicron Music Fraternity, is listed in Dictionary of International Biography, Cambridge, England, and is featured in the School Musician. Recently he was honored as a Distinguished Alumnus of Middle Tennessee State University.

Dr. Raphael Bundage, Guest Conductor

Raphael Bundage, newly appointed director of Choral Activities at MTSU, holds bachelor's degrees from Texas Christian University in music education and music history, and recently completed his master's and doctoral degrees at the Eastman School of Music. Prior to graduate work, Dr. Bundage was the supervisor of choral music for the Edinburg Public Schools-Edinburg, Texas, where he was also the conductor of the Valley Kantorei, a professional choral organization which toured extensively throughout the Southwest and northern Mexico. While at Eastman, he was assistant conductor to the Eastman Chorale and the Eastman-Rochester Chorus under the direction of Donald Neuen. He was the conductor to the Eastman Chamber Singers and produced Eastman's first Christmas Madrigal Dinner in December, 1984. Presently, in addition to his activities at MTSU, Dr. Bundage is a member of the Atlanta Symphony Chorus and is studying privately in the area of choral conducting with its director, Robert Shaw.
